Nuclear in the

EAST OF ENGLAND

For over 60 years nuclear power has been at the heart of the East of England's energy landscape, the only place globally with live decommissioning, an operational reactor and a twin reactor new build programme. This unique combination underpins the East of England's critical role in the UK's nuclear future. We're building on these strengths to enable our communities to benefit from nuclear power for generations to come.

These include:

- Developing a nuclear operations and maintenance (O&M) cluster, centred around operational reactors at Sizewell, Suffolk
- Building capacity and capability locally to support nuclear new-build through the Sizewell C Supply Chain and Sizewell C Consortium
- Facilitating the creation of a permanent outage supply chain, able to win contracts locally and nationally
- Creating an environment which fosters innovation and commercialisation in nuclear O&M
- Supporting decommissioning expertise, based on expertise gained at Sizewell A, able to operate nationally and internationally
- Collaborating with further and higher education providers to ensure a comprehensive approach to skills and workforce development
- Leveraging our technical specialisms and infrastructure including Freeports in the East, to realise Small Modular Reactor (SMR) opportunities in the region and globally
- Advancing an energy 'supercluster' building on strengths and expertise in nuclear, offshore wind, low carbon hydrogen, solar, gas, and carbon capture & storage

Our Aim: To develop a Nuclear East cluster, bringing together our strengths in operations, new build and decommissioning, positioning the East of England as a centre of nuclear excellence, nationally and internationally.

Sizewell B

Since 1995 Sizewell B (SZB) has generated 258 TWh of zero carbon electricity, powering 2.5 million homes.

Employing 520 full time staff and 250 full-time contract partners, SZB brings £40 million into the local economy annually, and an extra £30 million in an outage year, when the workforce grows by 1,000 additional people.

Plans are afoot for a 20-year extension to the operational life of SZB, presenting significant economic opportunities for the nuclear supply chain.

Sizewell C

Construction of Sizewell C (SZC) will deliver considerable economic, social and environmental benefits to Suffolk, the East of England and the UK.

The project will support 70,000 jobs during construction, including 7,900 in Suffolk during 'peak' construction, and 1,500 apprentices.

When operational, SZC will employ 900 permanent people, providing 3.2 GW of low carbon electricity, enough to power 6 million homes.

The SZC Skills Charter with ECITB, CITB, SZC and local councils, is a first-of-a-kind partnership supporting skills development across the nuclear and construction sectors.

Bradwell B

Bradwell B is a proposed 2.2 GW nuclear power station which could power up to 4 million homes, bringing billions of pounds of new investment into Essex, the East of England and the UK.



Sizewell A

Sizewell A ceased generation in 2006 after 40 years of operation, defueling was completed in 2014. The demolition of most of the site's buildings will continue until the mid-2030s



Decommissioning activities and ongoing site care and maintenance phases continue to provide supply chain opportunities and jobs in the East of England.
